The Moon may be the remains of a clash our Earth had over 450 billion years ago!

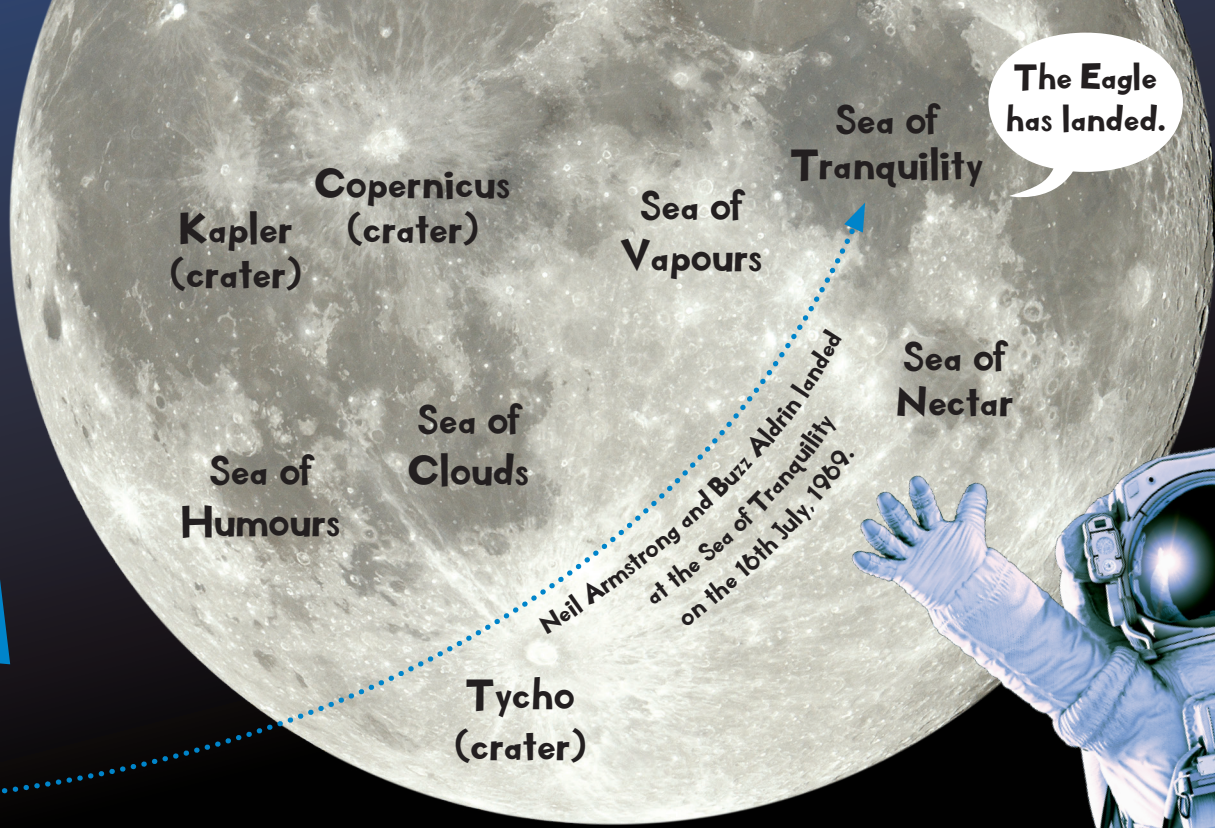


Boom!

The moon's gravity is 17% of Earth's strength. Things would weigh a lot **less** on the **moon**.



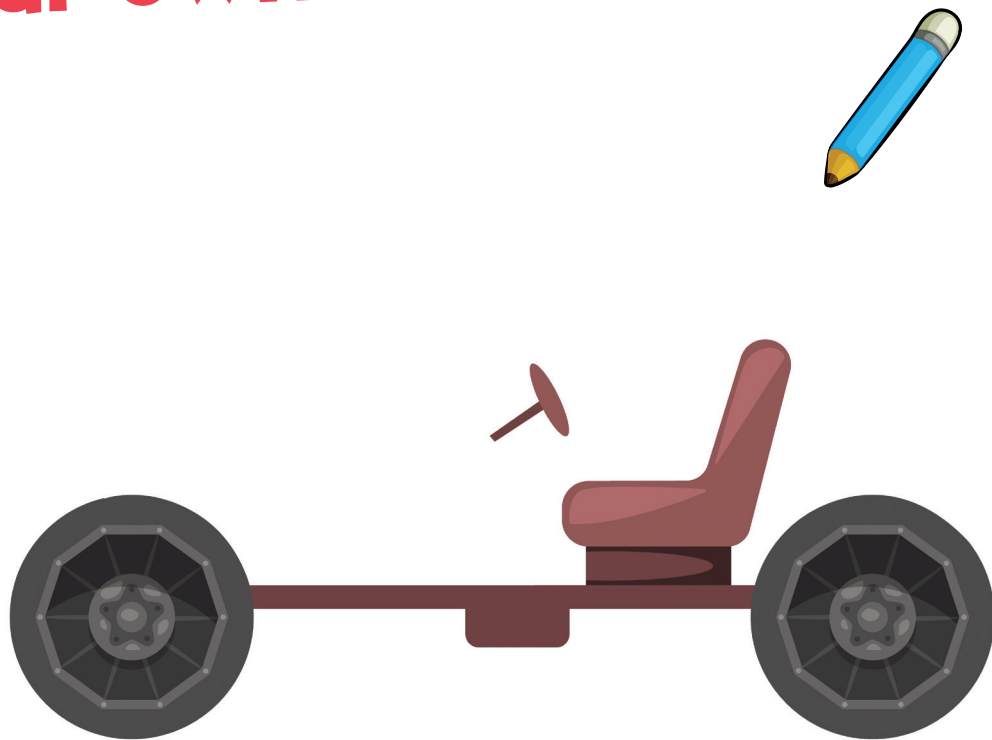
If we had no moon...
