3 top tips!

1. Get your child's attention. Turn off the TV and radio.

2. Start conversations by using open questions with lots of possible answers, for example, 'Tell me how you are feeling today'.

3. Let children see your mouth forming the letters and words.

Gather these items from around your house to enchance play, such as:

 Teddies and other toys to be patients.

 Paper and crayons to write pretend medicine presciptions with.

 Empty hand gel bottle to clean your hands.

Toy stethoscope, thermometre and watch.

 Loo roll for pretend bandages.

What to say:

 Ask your child to listen to your heart beat and check your pulse.

• Relax, have fun and keep talking!

• Model things a doctor might say...

- How are you today?
- Say 'ah'
- Remember to drink plenty of water.
- Swap roles.

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<u>Mathematics</u> - Providing children with opportunities to practise and improve their skills in counting numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems and to describe shapes, spaces and measures. <u>Expressive Arts and Design</u> - Supporting children to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials, as well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role play, and design and technology.
