Setting up:

Gather these items from around your house to enchance play, such as:

- Teddies and other toys to be patients.
- Paper and crayons to write pretend medicine presciptions with.
- Empty hand gel bottle to clean your hands.
- Toy stethoscope, thermometre and watch.
- Loo roll for pretend bandages.

What to say:

- Ask your child to listen to your heart beat and check your pulse.
- · Relax, have fun and keep talking!
- Model things a doctor might say...
 - How are you today?
 - Say 'ah'
 - Remember to drink plenty of water.
- Swap roles.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development - Helping children to develop a positive sense of themselves and others. To form positive relationships and develop respector others; to develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings; to understand appropriate behaviour in groups; and to have confidence in their own abilities. Associated Early Learning Goals: ELG 06, ELG 07, ELG 08.

<u>Understanding of the world</u> - Guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community through opportunities to explore, observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment. **Associated Early Learning Goals: ELG 13.**

Literacy <u>Development</u> - Encouraging children to read and write, both through listening to others reading, and being encouraged to begin to read and write themselves. Children must be given access to a wide range of reading materials - for example books, poems, and other materials to ignite their interest. Associated Early Learning Goals: ELG 09, ELG 10.

Mathematics - Providing children with opportunities to practise and improve their skills in counting numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems and to describe shapes, spaces and measures. Associated Early Learning Goals: ELG 11, ELG 12.

Expressive Arts and Design - Supporting children to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials, as well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role play, and design and technology. Associated Early Learning Goals: ELG 16, ELG 17.
